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NSPCC	Online Grooming Crimes Against Children Increase by 89% in Six Years The NSPCC have reported that online grooming crimes against children have seen an exponential increase since 2017/18 when the offence first came into force. Over 7,000 incidents were recorded last year, with Snapchat being largest platform for means of communication (48%), followed by WhatsApp (12%). Read the full report here.
GOV.UK	Child Poverty The Government has published a policy paper laying out a framework for the develop- ment of a UK-wide child poverty strategy. Key areas of the strategy will include increas- ing family incomes, reducing costs of essentials for low income families, and providing local support focusing especially on children's early years.
