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NSPCC Learning	Domestic Abuse in Pregnancy Research by For Baby's Sake suggests that domestic abuse was a factor in almost 50,000 babies per year being referred to children's social care in England between 2021 and 2023. The NSPCC Helpline domestic abuse project lead, Paddi Vint, has teamed up with the CEO of For Baby's Sake Trust to produce a podcast about the research and what can be learned from it. Centre of expertise on child sexual abuse	The CSA Centre have the Communicating with Children Guide, which gives all people working with children guidance in talking about child sexual abuse, explaining what may be going on for children when they are being sexually abused, what prevents children from talking about their abuse, and what professionals can do to help children communicate what is happening. women's aid until women & children are safe	Domestic Abuse Homicides Women's Aid has published its third child homicides report focussing on children who have been killed by a parent who was a perpetrator of domestic violence. Key themes from the report include: recognising children's experiences; professionals' understanding of coercive and controlling behaviour; understanding child contact as a tool to manipu- late professionals; and supporting non-abusive parents. NSPCC Learning	National Audit on Group-Based CSE and Abuse NSPCC Learning have published a CASPAR Briefing summarising the national audit on group-based child sexual exploitation and abuse. The report was commissioned by the Prime Minister and Home Secretary to evaluate our understanding of the scale, nature and drivers of child sexual exploitation and abuse by 'grooming gangs' in England and Wales. 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Building Families, Building Future Report

Barnardo's has published a new report on the impact of Family Hubs in England, which sets out how hubs support parents and their children and explores their role in tackling social issues such as helping prevent the need for entry into care and helping divert older children away from youth crime.
